Sheffield theatre company will present Flowers for Mrs Harris, a new musical, next month.

Rehearsals are well underway for a new musical, heading back to Sheffield after its hugely successful World Premiere at The Crucible Theatre in 2016.

'Flowers for Mrs Harris' scooped the UK Theatre Awards for *Best Musical Production, Best Performer in a Musical* and *Best Design* that year - and the memory for anyone who was lucky enough to see that production will most definitely have stuck with them.

The story tells of Ada Harris, a cleaner, and her dream of making the impossible possible. Something deep within Ada awakens when she happens upon something that simply takes her breath away and she realises she must have it, whatever the cost. Believing it will change her life for the better, she sets off on a journey from the post-war cobbled streets of London to the magical avenues of Paris, that not only transforms her life but the life of everyone she meets along the way.
